At the last meeting we briefly discussed the issue of the cuts to the NHS and the plans to close the minor injuries unit. We learned at the meeting that 95,000 people in Sheffield suffer from some sort of

mental health problem and we will discuss this in more detail at our next meeting.

The Sheffield Methodist Circuit Justice and Peace Mission Action Group is one of four mission action groups set up by the circuit. The remit of the group is to focus on social justice and related issues locally, nationally and globally and to look at what we, as a circuit, can offer to support these issues.

In the last two years we have organised two circuit services: one focussing on good work tackling social justice and environmental issues in the city; and a second highlighting links within the Circuit to churches and mission overseas. We also organised a series of 'Behind the Headlines' events that tackled the problems of climate change, the situation in Palestine and issues around ethical consumerism and third-world debt.

We are a group of enthusiastic individuals who are passionate about social justice issues. Individually, members link to Church Action on Poverty, Sheffield Climate Alliance, Eco Church, Global Justice Now, Fairtrade and Kairos Sheffield to name but a few. We also link with other faiths to work together on these issues.
