
Hope for the Future ...

The Climate Challenge



The Campaign in Brief

Dangerous climate change may well be unavoidable within 20 years if we do not reduce our CO2 emissions drastically *now*. This campaign is a wake-up call to our politicians to act *now*. For this to happen we need thousands of people to write to them *now*. Make sure you're one of them! Both the desperate peasant farmer in Rwanda facing persistent drought and the farmer in Norfolk wondering whether his farm will be flooded have good reason to worry. If we continue to emit greenhouse gases at current rates, within as little as 20 years the world can expect more heat waves, droughts and extreme weather with a rise in sea levels of between 26 cm and 82 cm (10-32 inches) by 2100. But things could be much worse as the present rate of greenhouse gas emissions is actually *increasing* by about 3% a year.

The situation is critical. We must take decisive action NOW. So what can we do? At least three things:

• Prayer

To say that any campaign must be rooted in prayer is not just a cursory nod in God's direction, but recognition that we need to allow ourselves to be filled with a passionate love, not only of God, but also for God's earth.

"The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it."

(Psalm 24:1)

• Practice

There are many practical things we can do: re-cycling, home insulation, shopping locally, using renewable energy, flying only when it is unavoidable. For many others, visit: www.climatecare.org/climate/low-carbon-living.

Such commitments are important but they are not enough.

• Politics

Thousands of us need to write to our politicians to get effective action on climate change. We also need to encourage family, friends, work colleagues and church members to write as well. It would be good if you could enclose photos of your children or loved ones from the next generation.

A model letter to send to politicians

I am deeply concerned about humanity's wholly inadequate efforts to respond to climate change.

I want you and your party to tackle climate change with commitment and determination so that future generations, in this country and across the world, will have a future in which they can flourish. I want you to do this for [...]* whom I love.

At the very least, please press for your party to show in its Manifesto for the 2015 General Election how it will, as required by law, reach the target of an 80% reduction in our greenhouse gas emissions by 2050 giving precise targets and dates. This will give the UK a stronger hand in the vital negotiations for an international agreement.

This in itself may not be sufficient. The IPCC Report of September 2013 indicates that the science really requires a 90% reduction by 2030. I realise that this would be challenging politically but that does not alter the science.
